TwitterworldNews.com works to secure your personal information by using ethical procedures. We make every effort to safeguard the confidentiality of your personal information. You should be aware of how we gather and utilise your information because we do so when you use our website. Our procedures for collecting personal information are outlined on this page.

The method via which we obtain personal data

TwitterworldNews.com only obtains your consent to collect any personal information when you fill out a form on our website, or by sending us an email. No data is gathered automatically.

Use of personal information

The staff of twitterworldnews.com only uses the personal data obtained for the purposes specified at the time of collection, or in a manner consistent with those purposes. Your information is not disclosed to any outside parties by us.

As already stated, we utilise your personal data to properly handle your requests and provide you with the information you require. All of the information you willingly share with us is also used to enable you to access our site. Using this information, we may be able to tailor our website in the future or better arrange the content based on user preferences.

We may use your personal information to send you newsletters if you have given us permission to do so in order to provide you with the best service possible.

Sharing your personal information

Without your consent, we will never share your personal information with any other people or organisations, including government agencies, or businesses, unless required to do so by law. Your information is not shared, sold, or disclosed to mailing lists by us. If you ask, we'll offer to add your email address to a list server or mailing list for twitterworldnews.com. In the latter scenario, you can always request that we take your name off of these lists. The sole exception is if we must share your information with government authorities upon request or if required to do so by law or a court order.

Your personal information and how it is stored

Your file is kept by us. Furthermore, we employ and implement necessary security measures to protect the confidentiality of your information.

Twitterworldnews.com, for example, employs software to monitor network traffic in order to detect unauthorised attempts to download or change material, or to otherwise harm the site. This software receives and saves the visitor's IP address, the date and time of the visit, and the pages viewed. Unless an intrusion or disruption attempt is detected, we make no attempt to link these addresses to the identity of those who visit our site.

Legal protection

The federal government's Privacy Act protects all personal information you provide. This means that you have the right to know when information is collected and to be informed of the purpose of such collection, as well as the right to access that information. We are required by law to keep all personal information you supply for at least two years after its usage in order for you to have reasonable access to it. Your personal information will be erased after that time.

Viewing and gaining access to your personal data

Cookies

To identify your machine, we employ a cookie, a browser component. When you visit websites, little data files called cookies are stored on your computer's hard disc. These files facilitate website navigation.

Cookies are not and cannot be used by us to access your computer's personal data. Instead, the data is gathered for statistical analysis, which includes determining the number of visits and the most popular pages.

Every time a website requests your consent to save a cookie on your computer, a popup will appear if you set your browser to warn you before accepting cookies. By setting your browser to reject cookies, you can decline to accept them.

Using the internet
